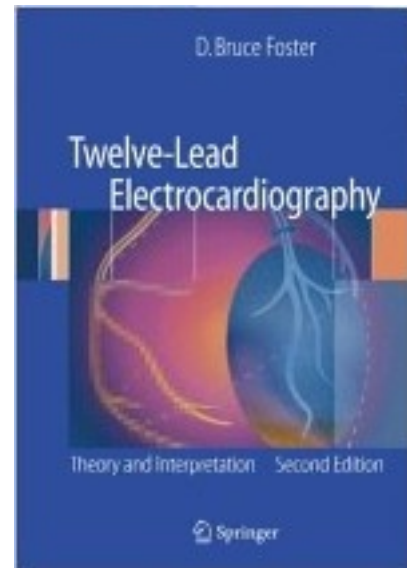




12-Lead Electrocardiography For ACLS Providers
